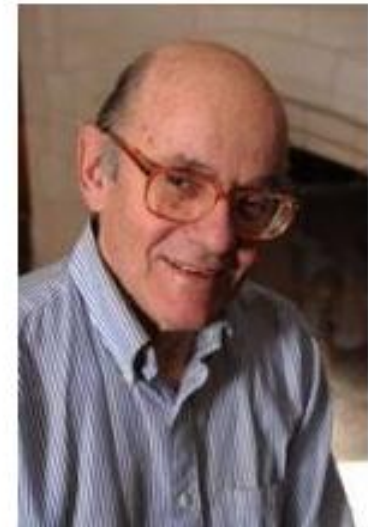

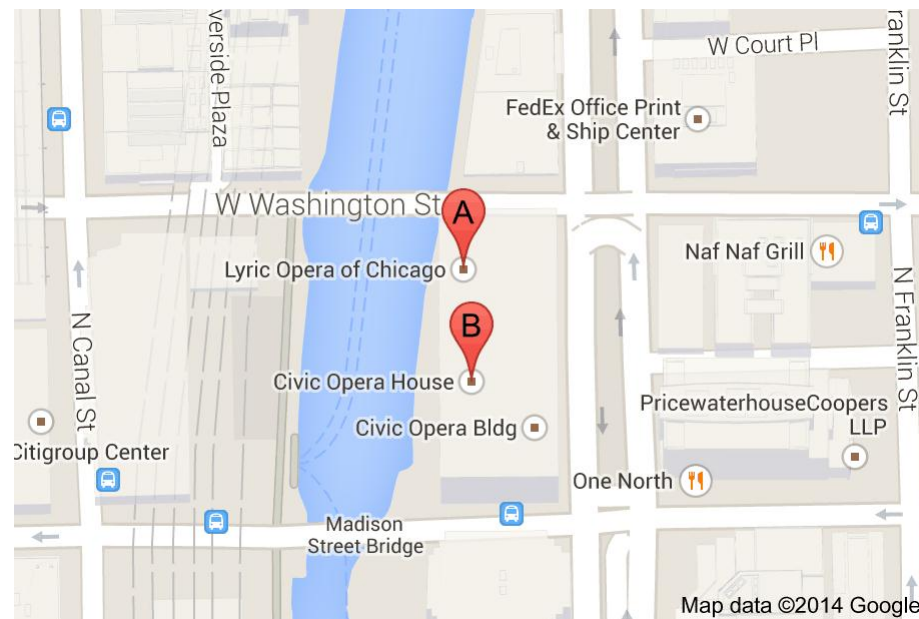
Getting There
